Since 1988, each year the CNCDH (the French National Consultative Committee on Human Rights) has awarded its "Liberty, Equality, Fraternity" Human Rights Prize of the French Republic on International Human Rights Day on 10 December. This award recognises projects carried out in France or abroad, without consideration of nationality or national borders, aimed at promoting and protecting human rights. The winners of the Human Rights Prize benefit from French diplomatic protection.
